


#### Uranium Mines


- From 1944 to 1986, nearly 30 million tons of uranium ore were extracted from Navajo lands
- EPA has mapped 521
   abandoned uranium mines located within the boundaries of the Navajo Nation.
- The Navajo Nation banned U mining in 2005.





Groundwater, Surface-Water, and Water-Chemistry Data, Black Mesa Area, Northeastern Arizona




# A component of the San Juan River Basin of New Mexico Water Rights Settlement



## **Navajo Nation Lands in Utah**



### Quantification of Navajo Nation Water Rights in Utah

- Right to **DEPLETE 81,500 AFY** of surface & ground water
- Right to DIVERT & STORE 435 CFS, potentially as much as 314,851 AFY
- Ability to MARKET WATER RIGHTS to the same extent as other Utah water rights holders
- Existing Navajo Uses surveyed and protected
- Navajo Nation Claims to Reserved Water Rights held in trust by the United States – not subject to loss through forfeiture, abandonment or non-use
